
Parents / Guardians

Students who are eligible for Free or Reduced meals, receive an eligibility letter as well as a parent consent form, in the mail. Eligibility letters need to be retained for the entire school year. Student's on Free or Reduced lunch status qualify for many benefits including a reduced rate in EDEP, waivers for SAT/ACT, discounts on Spectrum and some sports programs. To qualify, parents would need to produce their child's eligibility letter as proof they receive Free or Reduced meals. Free and Reduced lunch Statuses are confidential and cannot be released to anyone without a signed consent form.
