Bringing Enrichment And Children Home

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Help for your family

The state of Florida passed a law (chapter 984) that provides help to families and children who need services to improve the child's behavior, help the family to move beyond crisis, and prevent further problems. The Florida Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) funds and supports these programs to keep kids out of serious trouble. BEACH House is a also partner of the Florida Network.

Services are provided on a non residential basis to youth ages 10 - 17 who are runaway, truant, or ungovernable. Youth and their families are linked to a service manager who does an assessment of the issues at hand, and works with the family to secure the best possible remedies. A plan is created that best fits the youth and family needs and goals. Services include case monitoring, crisis counseling, information, referral, and linkages to other services.



Annual 5K Fundraiser

BEACH House hosts an annual fundraiser, the Ocean Deck 5K & Fun Run to benefit BEACH House, every November during National Runaway Prevention Month. This event raises both awareness in the community and additional funding to assist with programming in the shelter. Corporate, community and individual support of the 5K plays an integral part in the success of the program.



Shelter

BEACH House shelter provides crisis shelter for youth ages 10 - 17 who display runaway, truant, and ungovernable behaviors. BEACH House provides a short "time out" period to give families the opportunity to cool off so they can begin to work on the family issues. The aim is to enhance family communication skills and reunification. Services include shelter, food, clothing, individual and group counseling, life skills, education, and referral.

Safe Place

BEACH House runaway and homeless shelter serves youth from all over the country. This is necessary because of the special transient population of Volusia and Flagler counties and the special events that draw youth to this area from all over the country. Any youth can walk into a business that displays the Safe Place sign to access immediate help. Safe Place involves the business community, youth service agencies and volunteers to make access to safety readily available. Safe Place sites, identified by the diamond shaped, yellow and black Safe Place sign, are conveniently located in areas where the need is greatest.
