# **Kindergarten Readiness**

Kindergarten readiness is a journey and transition into formal academic instruction offered in all public schools. Many skills and capabilities are needed for a successful transition. Research shows that students who have experienced a quality pre-kindergarten are more successful in the transition to kindergarten as well as the years that follow.

Kindergarten readiness does not mean already knowing kindergarten skills but rather it means having a foundation of knowledge and exposure that helps students accept kindergarten instruction more readily.

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Early Learning released Developmental Standards for Four-Year-Olds in 2011. The Standards describe skills that Four-year-olds should know and be able to do by the end of their pre-kindergarten year.

It is anticipated that through these learning goals, pre-kindergarten students will acquire the necessary knowledge and skills for successful transition into kindergarten.

#### Alphabet Knowledge

Benchmark a: Recognizes almost all letters

Benchmark b: Names most letters when shown

  Social & Emotional Development
- IV. Language, Communication & Emergent Literacy
- V. Cognitive Development & General Knowledge

Each domain represents a set of benchmarks that target the learning goals of four year old pre-k students. The skills are age appropriate and often establish necessary awareness for future kindergarten skills.

The Florida Department of Education recently released Kindergarten Florida State Standards that target learning goals for kindergarten students in public schools.
