Projects must address issues in one of the following areas:

- Education: Absenteeism, graduation rates, discipline, literacy,
- Financial Stability: Housing, income, access to good jobs, financial literacy,
- Health: diabetes, injury prevention, opioid crisis, food insecurity, healthy living, community safety,
- EDI: Equity, Diversity and Inclusion

Projects must work to improve the lives of ALICE families in Flagler and/or Volusia Counties.

How to Apply: (Applications Start August 2023)

- 1. Submit your letter of intent. Go to bit.ly/SIFapplication. This is the first screening process and is due by October 6, 2023.
- 2. Committee review. Selected applicants will be invited to submit a full grant proposal. Groups will be assigned a mentor to assist in developing the proposal. Full proposals will be due November 15, 2023.
- Initial Pitch Period. Selected Applicants will need to record a video of an elevator pitch for their project which will be reviewed by the board.
- 4. Pitch competition. Applicants will participate in a pitch competition in February of 2024. At this event, projects will be presented, and funding will be awarded.
