HVAC ribbon-cutting

- Launched our new heating, ventilation, and air conditioning program at Pine Ridge High
- Ribbon-cutting for new facility held in July
- Expanding Career Technical Education (CTE) programs
- VCS received grant to fund HVAC vocational and certification program

Summer Home Run Reading Challenge

- Huge success to help with summer learning 1,230 students participated in challenge with VCS and the Daytona Tortugas
- Grades K-8 and they logged 606,479 minutes
- Won prizes, including a ticket to the ballgame Aug. 21 for completing the challenge (630 students completed)
- Citrus Grove Elem was the top school with 65,000 minutes read

Mask requirement update

- The Volusia County School Board voted Tuesday to require face coverings for K-12 students in schools and VCS facilities starting Tuesday, September 7. There will be a grace period the week of September 7 for families to obtain a note from a medical professional requesting a medical exemption.
- The policy will continue until October 15, 2021 and will be re-visited by the School Board at their regularly scheduled meeting on October 12, 2021.
- Masks and/or face shields will be allowed.
- Masks will be worn inside all schools and facilities and may be removed outside.
- Masks will be required on buses.
- Employees will be required to wear face coverings until October 15, 2021 as well.
- Appropriate accommodations will be made for medical purposes on an individual basis in accordance with the ADA.

Rose Roland, asst. superintendent, student services, reviewed the COVID-19 Decision Tree Student Protocol

Dr. Mark Shanoff, chief operating officer shared the following information:

- PPE supplies are delivered within 24 hours to schools after an order is placed
- ventilation of classrooms are top priority
- CDC published 8-9 fresh air exchanges should be made per hour. All of VCS buildings including portables receive up to 10-12 fresh air exchanges per hour revision: When CDC provided such guidance, CDC recommendations are for 6-8 exchanges per hour, VCS buildings receive 8-9 exchanges per hour, and portables receive 10-12 exchanges per hour. VCS buildings are able to have up to 12 exchanges per hour (this depends on room occupancy and square footage).
- when positive case occurs room/office space is vacated for 24 hours and deep cleaning takes place
- bus driver shortage is happening nation wide
- working diligently on making adjustments to bus routes
- mask are required on buses
- all buses have a/c and provide fresh air exchange
- recently signed a contract to begin E-mist buses nightly very soon
