## ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION

In order to be eligible for school bus transportation service, the student must:

- Reside two or more miles from their assigned school, be a participant in a designated Exceptional Student Education (ESE) program with an active Individual Education Plan (IEP), or a 504 Plan that has been approved by the school principal or their designee.


## BUS STOP LOCATIONS

- Students should arrive at the bus stop location ten (10) minutes before scheduled time.
- Children should wait in a safe place well back from the side of the road.
- If students must cross the road to board a school bus, wait until the bus has arrived and all traffic has stopped; then wait for the signal from the school bus driver before crossing.
- The safety of children getting to and from bus stops, and while at the school bus stop location, requires the consistent and cooperative effort of parents.
- Parents are strongly urged to be at the pick-up and drop-off location each day or arrange for a responsible adult to be there.
- All bus stops are reviewed regularly for safety.


## AT ALL TIMES

1. Smile.
2. Be friendly. Be respectful.
3. Speak with students in a kind manner.
4. Speak with adults in a polite manner.

## COMMUNICATION

- Dispatch Daily Hours of Operation: 6:00am - 10:00am and 1:15pm - 5:15pm.
- If your student is not going to ride the morning bus, please notify the Dispatch Office prior to 6:00am.
- If a student fails to ride for three (3) consecutive days without the proper notification, bus ridership will cease until the parent/ guardian contacts the school or transportation.


## RIDING THE SCHOOL BUS

1. Respect the bus driver and attendant.
2. Be considerate to everyone on the bus, respecting the physical condition and property of the bus.
3. Students should refrain from using loud voices, profanity and/or obscene gestures. Respect the rights of others.
4. Keep the aisle clear. Books or bags are tripping hazards and can block the way in an emergency.
5. The driver is in complete charge and may assign seats.
6. To ensure student safety, students are to remain seated while the bus is in motion. Arms, hands, and heads should remain inside the bus.
7. To maintain cleanliness, there will be no eating or drinking on the school bus.
8. Do NOT litter on the bus or throw things from the bus.
9. Do NOT tamper with bus equipment, or the emergency exits.
10. Maintain complete silence at railroad crossings.
11. In case of an emergency, follow the directions of the bus driver or the police if the driver is unable to give instructions.
12. With the exception of an approved service dog, animals shall not be transported on the bus.
13. Glass containers are not allowed at any time.
14. Tobacco, lighters, or open flame are prohibited.
15. Parents may not ride the bus. Drivers are instructed not to let unauthorized adults on the bus. This is for the protection of all students.

> FAILURE TO ABIDE BY THESE RULES COULD RESULT IN A REMOVAL FROM THE BUS FOR ONE OR MORE DAYS.

## GETTING ON THE SCHOOL BUS

- Form a single line when boarding the bus.
- Do not push or shove others while in line.
- Hold the handrail when getting on the bus.
- Enter your student ID \# on the keypad.
- Quickly find your seat and remain seated.
- Buckle your seatbelt. Safety first!



## GETTING OFF THE SCHOOL BUS

- Do not get up to leave until the bus has stopped.
- Enter your student ID \# on the keypad before exiting.
- To ensure student safety, students should exit the bus at their assigned bus stop.
- If you need to cross the road when getting off the bus, walk to the end of the stop arm. Cross only after the driver signals that it is safe.
- Make sure the bus driver can see you.
- Always stay away from the bus's back end and tires.
